Nelly and I are extremely grateful for all the e-mails, calls and prayers on our behalf during the time that hurricane Felix was approaching the coast of Honduras. Except for floods that were caused by the amount of rain, we were okay. Nelly has family in the northern section of Nicaragua that was greatly affected by the storm. Even now they continue to be homeless, and lacking many basic needs. Please keep them in your prayers.

Also, at the time of writing this letter, Nelly is again at her mother's bedside in a Miami hospital. Due to the diabetes my mother-in-law suffers from, it seems the doctors may have to amputate her right foot. The decision will be made later and I will inform you in our next letter.

September was a VERY busy month for all of Honduras. On the 10th we celebrated Children's Day!! On the 15th we celebrated Independences Day, and all month long was Bible Month, with a very large parade on the 30th to end the celebrations. Honduras is 50% evangelical. While most people know that the Bible is our Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth, many do not live by them.

Pray with us for our countries this month like never before. We know our enemy would like to see all of us destroyed and lost. Together let's purpose in our heart like Daniel, not to defile ourselves with the meats (delights) of this world, but live separated unto the Lord our God!!! Daniel 1:8; II Timothy 2:21

On the 21st of this month I will be 49 years old. (I am wondering if I will have to grow up before turning 50!!) Nelanie will be 13 on the 24th (she already thinks she's grown up!!). Now Mary Lou (not her real name) is one of the newly "adopted" foster daughters and is still serving prison time. On the 23rd of the month she will be 27 years old. Why did we adopt such an older person you ask? Well, all she wanted was a family who would understand and counsel her. She is an orphan who by the age of 20 became one of the most feared and dangerous female gang members in Latin America. The list of those who would like to see her dead includes members of her old gang; members of the rival gang; police officers (she was a cop killer); and the general public. I tell her she is going to be the female version of the apostle Paul. Soon she will be released from jail and long ago asked me to help her live the new life in Christ. I tell you this to ask your prayers for her, and for Nelly and me. This is the most serious matter we have ever undertaken.
